A GUIDE TO FIRE EXTINGUISHER SAFETY!

How many people here have ever had to use a fire extinguisher? How many people here have ever taken a fire extinguisher class before?

Theory of Fire/ Fire Triangle

• Fuel

Air (Oxygen)
Source of Heat

Types of Fires:

Solid fuel fires (wood, paper, plastic, cloth, etc.)
Electrical fires (sockets, crossed wires, etc.)
Fuel fires (gasoline, diesel fuel, alcohol, etc.)
Chemical fires (household chemicals, fertilizers, etc.)
Grease fires

Type of Extinguishers:

• Dry Powder

- •*CO2*
- Water

• Chemical – (ABC Most Common)

Purpose for using an extinguisher:
Used on small fires just starting. (Incipient)
Trying to eliminate 1 of the elements in the fire triangle.

•Making sure you have the right extinguisher for the type of fire you have.

Extinguisher Do's and Don'ts: • Do – always keep your safety a priority! Do – always keep others safety a priority! • Do – know the location of fire extinguishers! • Do – Never Be Afraid to call 911!!

Do's and Don'ts:

- Don't try to put out a fire that is too large!
- Don't get yourself painted in a corner! (have a way out!)

A fire can double in size every 30 seconds!!

How many people have heard of it?
Do you know or remember what the letters stand for?
Only if you use an extinguisher correctly will it help

you in putting out a fire!!

How to use a Fire Extinguisher:

Carry with pin in place.

• Pull the pin. (Step 1 = P)

• Stand approximately 10 to 12 feet away

•Aim the nozzle at the base of the fire (that is where the reaction is going on). (Step 2 = A)

How to use a Fire Extinguisher:

Squeeze the handle and the extinguisher will fire. (Step 3=S)
Sweep side to side at the base of the fire. Depending on the substance, try not to blow the product around. Step 4 = S)
Release the handle to stop using the extinguisher to let the air clear so you can see if the fire is out.

Final Points To Remember:

• If you discharge all the material in the extinguisher, back out and find another.

- ALWAYS leave your self an escape route.
- Think SAFETY when attempting to put out a fire with an extinguisher.

Final Points To Remember:

 Any extinguisher should be checked by an authorized agent if an attempt was made to use it.

 Make sure your Company is doing the proper monthly and yearly inspections of their extinguishers.

• ALWAYS REMEMBER TO CALL 911!!!!
