Emergency Management


What and Who are We?

- Designed to function as a coordinating and resource body during disasters.
- Every County is required by law to have an Emergency Management Agency.
- All EMA's are different.



Emergency Management

- Planning
- Logistics
- Relationship Building
- Mass Notification



Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC)

Required

ORC 3750.03 provides that the LEPC is the planning entity within the planning district as established by the SERC.

Reporting

OAC 3750 is the section that covers Tier II reporting for hazardous and dangerous chemicals.

Grants

Apply for, support, and fulfill grant management responsibilities.

Exercise


Required to conduct exercises and meet all 13 objectives within a 5 year cycle.

Emergency Exercises



Tabletop

Discussion based session where team members meet in an informal, classroom setting to discuss their roles during and emergency



Full-Scale

Multi-agency exercise designed to evaluate the operational capability of emergency management systems in a highly stressful environment that simulates actual response conditions.




Functional

A fully simulated interactive exercise that tests the capability of an organization to respond to a simulated event.


